Potential Emergencies:

- Medical
- Weather
- Personal Safety

Emergency Procedures

Medical

- medical personnel on site will be contact by cell phone
- these personnel will be Paramedic or St. John's
- 911 will be called if the medical emergency requires their assistance

Weather

- all athletes and spectators will be moved inside to the school gymnasium
- everyone will remain inside until the weather has cleared

Safety

- if there is an unwanted person on site, this person will be asked to leave by security
- if the person presents a danger to the event, athletes and spectators will be asked to move into the school for safety
- 911 will be called

Location of Emergency Equipment

There will be a first aid tent set up out on the field. At this station will be a trained paramedic. There is a possibility that St. John's will also be in attendance. Both of these trained individuals groups will be providing their own equipment.

Emergency Response Training Requirements

Each track coach for each team will also be trained in first aid as will many of the people working at each of the events. This training is an update every 2 to 3 years.

Location and Use of Emergency Facilities

For all emergencies we would call 911 (fire, ambulance, police, hospital, etc). Response time in the City of Red Deer is approximately 5 minutes.

Nearest Hospital (3942 50A Avenue, Red Deer)

Route to Hospital

- Take 55 Street west to 50 Avenue (Gaetz)
- Turn left on 50 Avenue (heading south)
- Turn right onto to 42 Street
- The hospital will be on your right

The hospital is 3.3 km away from Lindsay Thurber (estimated time 8 minutes)
