Must be in Grade 10 and/or 11

RETURNING STUDENTS

Can be in Grade 11 or 12

Must have attended a past !MPACT workshop

ADVISOR DELEGATES

Each school may bring up to a maximum of 2 advisors who:

- Have good supervisory skills
- Work well with young adults and adolescents (friendly and well-liked)
- Have an ability to interact well one-on-one or with small groups of students
- Are willing to take conference information and skills back to local school and communities to disseminate to others
- Are responsible
- Able to relate to students from a variety of social groups
- Have high motivation and enthusiasm
- Have experience with high school student leaders and high school activities

BREAKOUT SESSION #1

ON-SITE ACCOMMODATIONS AVAILABLE

BOOK OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS

Overnight accommodations are available at the Olds College Centennial Village Student Housing for all registered schools.

Room rates and capacities are as follows:

- 1 double bed, single occupancy = \$70 + GST + 4% tourism tax
- 1 double bed, double occupancy = \$80 + GST + 4% tourism tax
- 1 double bed + single cot, triple occupancy = \$90 + GST + 4% tourism tax
