Can be in Grade 11 or 12

- Have good supervisory skills
- Work well with young adults and adolescents (friendly and well-liked)
- Have an ability to interact well one-on-one or with small groups of students
- Are willing to take conference information and skills back to local school and communities to disseminate to others
- Are responsible
- Able to relate to students from a variety of social groups
- Have high motivation and enthusiasm
- Have experience with high school student leaders and high school activities

## POSITIVE VALUES AND PERSPECTIVES

### BREAKOUT SESSION

It's hard to know what values are most important because there are so many positive values that leaders are expected to hold and demonstrate. In this session, delegates will come to consensus about the positive values they collectively hold. They will gain a better understanding of the pivotal role they play in upholding positive values and learn how keeping perspective can help them more consistently demonstrate their positive values. # ON-SITE ACCOMMODATIONS AVAILABLE

## BOOK OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS

Overnight accommodations are available at the Olds College Centennial Village Student Housing for all registered schools.

Room rates and capacities are as follows:

- 1 double bed, single occupancy = \$72 + GST + 4% tourism tax
- 1 double bed, double occupancy = \$82 + GST + 4% tourism tax
- 1 double bed + single cot, triple occupancy = \$90 + GST + 4% tourism tax

**NOTE:** Accommodations are additional fees booked at the expense of the registering school. These rates are **NOT** included in the event registration fees. Schools will be billed separately by Olds College.

Please complete the accommodations section of the event registration form to request rooms at Olds College. The event coordinator will book your rooms accordingly. ## HOTEL BLOCK BOOKING

A limited number of rooms have been block off under Impact at the Ramada by Wyndham Olds. **These rooms are on a first come, first serve basis and will be held until April 4th.** Room rates and capacities are as follows:

- 2 queen beds , 4 person occupancy = \$121 + GST + 4% tourism tax
- 3 queen beds , 6 person occupancy = \$131 + GST + 4% tourism tax

**NOTE:** Accommodations are additional fees booked at the expense of the registering school. These rates are **NOT** included in the event registration fees. **Check in time is 3pm, if you want to check in earlier that 3pm, you must contact the hotel and there will be a 10% surcharge.**
