## **PAYMENTS:**

Entry Fee: \$530 per team + \$1 per athlete Loonie Fee

ALL PAYMENTS including the entry fee, banquet fees and ASAA "Pay It Forward Scholarship" Loonie Fee must be paid in one cheque payable to Stirling School, to be handed in at the Coaches Meeting at 8:15 pm on Wednesday night. A receipt for the tournament fees will be given to coaches at that time. Players and coaches will receive a bag with an assortment of gift items, a lanyard with ID and a tournament program. These will be given to each coach at the Coaches Meeting.

#### **BANQUET:**

Banquet attendance is mandatory for all teams. Please indicate the number of official team members, including coaches, players, and managers that will be attending the banquet (maximum 18 people per team). Doors will open at 7:00pm with dinner served at 7:30pm. Dress code for the banquet is business casual or team wear.

#### **PRACTICE TIMES:**

Practice times will be available on Wednesday, March 13 from 11:15 AM to 8:00 PM. Each team will be allotted one 45-minute time slot, which will be scheduled to coordinate with their team picture session. Schedules are assigned with teams traveling the longest distances getting the later slots. Practice will be timed and when time is up, teams will be required to leave the gymnasium. Teams waiting to use the court for their practice must wait outside the gymnasium in the atrium. The final practice schedule and team picture session will be posted on the Information Package website page as well as updated in the information package as soon as all teams have registered. #### **TEAM ROOMS:**

Teams will share 2 team rooms throughout the weekend. CL101 will be assigned to the home/higher ranked team. CL102 will be assigned to the away/lower ranked team. Your team will have access to the room 30 minutes prior to and 30 minutes after each game. Please do not leave any items in these rooms as other teams will be accessing them while you are playing your game.

### **COACH / CAPTAIN MEETINGS:**

The Coach Meeting will be held on Wednesday, March 13 at 8:15 PM in CL 101 at Stirling School. The head official will be in attendance. Team packages will be distributed at this time for you to hand out to your players. Simultaneously, there will be a Captains Meeting in CL 102 at Stirling School. Having a team representative in attendance at these meetings is *mandatory* as this is where pertinent championship information will be provided and fees collected. Questions will also be answered at this time. ALL PAYMENTS including the entry fee and banquet fees must be brought to the coaches meeting in one cheque payable to Stirling School.

## **OPENING / CLOSING CEREMONIES:**

The Opening Ceremonies will take place on Thursday, March 14 at 1:30 PM in the Stirling School gymnasium. Please assemble your team in the Atrium by 1:15 PM so we can organize the teams. Please have your athletes dressed in their uniforms or team apparel and wearing indoor shoes.

### **PLAQUES:**

The consolation plaque, fourth place plaque, third place plaque and bronze medals will all be handed out at the conclusion of each respective game. This will allow teams to start heading home earlier if needed. Closing Ceremonies and gold / silver award presentations will take place after the final game on Saturday.



## **GAME SCHEDULE:**

Please note that the highest ranked team will be designated as the Home Team for games and should wear their light-colored uniforms. The Stirling Lakers will always be designated as the Home Team. Schedule Approved by the ASAA – Appendix A

#### **RESULTS:**

Game results will be posted on the championship website as well as on the north glass wall of the learning commons attached to the atrium of Stirling School. No results will be physically posted at Raymond High School.

## PRACTICE / WARM-UP BASKETBALLS:

All basketballs will be provided by Stirling School for team practices, pre-game warm-ups, and games. Please do not bring your own basketballs.

#### **SHOWER FACILITIES:**

Shower facilities are available in the change rooms in the gymnasium. The designated home team (higher ranked team) may use the BOYS change room while the away team (lower ranked team) will take the GIRLS change room. Stirling School is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Teams are responsible for their own belongings throughout the weekend. Athletes wishing to shower immediately following the game can bring their gear to the gym to be stored in a locked storage room. Teams playing the next game cannot enter the change rooms in the gym until after half time of the current game, allowing teams time to shower if wanted.

#### **TEAM HOST / HOSTESS:**

There will be two host students assigned to each team during the tournament to assist them when needed. They will also be with the teams during the Opening Ceremonies, along with a community representative who will lead your team in to the gym.

#### SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT:

Spectators should:

- Consistently give positive feedback to players and others.
- Welcome opponents.
- Present positive comments before, during and after the game. Spectators, both student and adult, must
  demonstrate courtesy and good sportsmanship by positive cheers of encouragement for their team, not
  against the opposing team. This is evidenced by the absence of booing and vulgarities.
- Be helpful to others (i.e. willingly offer information about the game, score, scheduling, venue locations, etc. to onlookers)
- Spectators must also show proper acceptance of officials' judgment.

Artificial noisemakers are not permitted during provincial championship tournaments/events. These noisemakers may include but are not limited to: air horns, cowbells, plastic tube horns, garbage can lids, etc. The provincial championship host shall have the authority to eject from the competition facility individuals who, following a warning, refuse to comply with this requirement. (ASAA 2018/19 Handbook, P. 27-28)

## **SCHOOL REQUESTS:**

Please be advised that classes will be in session for both Stirling School and Raymond High School students for Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Please be courteous and respectful during this time, keeping team traffic to the gym section of the school. During school hours, there is to be absolutely no warming up or balls bouncing outside of the gymnasium. Please refrain from wearing soiled footwear on the gym floor; only clean, indoor shoes are permitted. We also ask that spectators stay off of the court at all times, including half time, to keep the surface clean and safe.

Please keep the team rooms neat for the teacher who works there. It would be appreciated if all garbage would be placed in receptacles in the room prior to your departure. Please be respectful of the belongings in the classroom while you are using it. Thank you for your cooperation!

## SPORTSMANSHIP:

Sportsmanship is vitally important and highly valued by the ASAA. There will be a Sportsmanship plaque awarded to the team that displays appropriate individual and team conduct / sportsmanship throughout the Championship. Pins will be handed out throughout the event to individuals, including spectators, who display sportsmanship in their words and actions. The sportsmanship committee will be deciding who receives these awards.



## **BANQUET:**

Banquet tickets must be ordered online during team registration by NOON on Monday, March 11, 2019. We will be hosting a DINNER on Thursday evening after the games are completed for the day. Expect great food, entertainment, and prizes! The highlight of the banquet will be our featured guest speaker, Danny Balderson.

Danny Balderson was born and raised in Magrath, a small town 15 minutes West of Stirling. In High School, Danny led the Magrath Zeniths to the 4A Boys Basketball Championship. After High School Danny played 5 years for the University of Lethbridge Pronghorns. During that time, Danny was awarded Canada West and CIS Rookie of the Year, he received 4 Canada West First Team All Stars, 3 CIS All Canadian Awards, 2 Canada West Most Valuable Player Awards and was awarded the CIS Most Valuable Player Award. During that time, the Pronghorns were routinely one of the top 5 teams in Canada and spent many weeks in the #1 position during his final seasons. Danny is the only player in the 50-year history of University of Lethbridge Men's basketball to have his #31 jersey retired.

In 1999 Danny was selected to be a member of the Canadian Student National Team. He ended up as the 3<sup>rd</sup> leading scorer on the team as they traveled through North America and Europe, eventually placing 5<sup>th</sup> at the World University Games in Palma, Spain. He scored 11 points in a tough, 5 pt. quarter final loss to the United States; a team filled with many NBA champions. He also scored 25 points against Mexico in an exhibition game in front of a packed stadium in Mexico City. He was checked the entire game by an All American from Oklahoma who would eventually have a long and productive career in the NBA, Eduardo Najara.

Danny is currently an Associate Professor in the Faculty of Education at the University of Lethbridge. Balderson's area of expertise is Physical Education Teacher Education. Dr. Balderson received his Ph.D. from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. His current research is centered around physical education teaching pedagogy and youth sport development. He has published numerous articles in this area and presents at National and International Conferences.

Danny lives on the Farm that his Great Grandfather homesteaded over 100 years ago. He enjoys mowing his lawn and raising a small herd of Longhorn cattle. He coaches basketball in the winter and baseball in the summer. He also gets the competitive juices flowing again when he backs into the roping box and chases steers in Team Roping competitions. His greatest enjoyment is spending time travelling, playing sports, and working with his wife and 6 children.

#### **RULES/POLICY:**

It is incumbent upon all coaches and participants to be aware of ASAA Policy. Specifically, for this event, player eligibility (p. 38-40), supervision policy (p. 51), and basketball policy (p. 82-92). Stirling School will be allowing athletes to "dunk" during games.

#### DISCIPLINE AND MISCONDUCT:

Breaches of the ASAA Code of Ethics are treated seriously, and as host we are required to report any breaches to the ASAA office where action may occur. As stated in the ASAA Code of Ethics, "any conduct, including, but not limited to ejections, fighting and drugs and alcohol use, that results in dishonor to the athlete, the team, the school or the ASAA will not be tolerated" (p. 28-30).


If a player or coach is disqualified from a game, that player or coach will receive a one game suspension. If it is the teacher sponsor that is disqualified, and no other teacher sponsor is available for that team, the team will not be allowed to participate in their following game.

#### **GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE:**

The committee will have the authority to address issues of a serious nature that may occur before, during, or after the Provincial Championship, or to hear appeals of the automatic suspension resulting from an ejection.







## **Appendix E: Emergency Action Plan**

#### EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN

- 1) First Aid Kit and ice at the score table in the gymnasium. AED is located on the wall immediately outside the main entrance to the gymnasium.
- 2) Cell phone at the score table. Land line inside the main office on the counter.
- 3) Ambulance 9-1-1. Hospital 403-752-3337 (Raymond) or 403-388-6111 (Lethbridge).
- 4) Enter main door of school on the West side of the building. Gym is through the atrium and north (left) once you have entered.
- 5) See attached google maps for best route to hospital.

## When an injury occurs:

- 1) Take control of the situation. Exercise universal precaution related to blood/body fluids.
- 2) Do not move the student if they cannot move themselves. Do not remove uniform unless deemed necessary.
- 3) Assess and evaluate the severity of the situation and decide if further assistance is required
- 4) If an ambulance is required, then determine the action required to remove the athlete form the playing surface.
- 5) If an ambulance is called: direct one person (the coach of the injured player) to call the ambulance and give the pertinent information to them. Include location, address and extent of injury. Ask person to report back with an ETA
- 6) Remain with injured student and address any concerns they have while awaiting medical attention.
- 7) Do not give food or drink to injured athlete unless required because of existing medical conditions (ex. Diabetes).
- 8) Stay calm and reassuring.
- 9) Once ambulance arrives explain situation and what has been done for the injured athlete.
- 10) Designate an adult to accompany the injured athlete to the hospital.
- 11) Parent/guardians of the injured athlete should must be contacted as soon as possible following the injury.
- 12) Complete the attached incident/accident report form and return it to the tournament organizer/administration.

## PROTOCOL IN EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY

- 1) Call Ambulance or Fire Department 9-1-1.
- 2) Stirling School 426 3 St S, Stirling (in the gym), 403-756-3355.
- 3) Indicate location and nature of injury.
- 4) Report to Coach/Administrator.
- 5) Meet Ambulance.

## IN THE EVENT OF A FACILITY LOCKDOWN

The school building may be put into a lockdown situation due to internal or external emergencies. Internal emergencies include an armed individual, a medical emergency, or an out of control child or adult. External emergencies include events occurring in close proximity to the school. Both internal and external emergencies will be treated in the same manner.

1. In the event of a lockdown the following message will be relayed over the school intercom system by the Principal or designate Ingeborg Pot, or anyone who is first aware of the situation:

## Lockdown, Lockdown

- 2. This message will be announced **three** times if safe to do so.
- 3. Visually check hallway for students, visitors, volunteers, etc. and invite them into classroom.
- 4. Direct students into your secure location and identified lockdown area. *If safe, all individuals in the gym will be escorted to the school theatre as a more secure location.*
- 5. Close room door (door should already be in locked position). Reinforce or block door with classroom furniture.
- 6. Cover inside windows. If threat is external wait for further instruction.
- 7. Staff should be prepared to call 911.
- 8. Direct students to silence cell phones.
- 9. Maintain a calm environment by remaining calm yourself and reassuring students that everything possible is being done to return the situation to normal.
- 10. Maintain Silence.
- 11. Stay out of view of doors and windows
- 12. Ignore all school / fire bells
- 13. Do not answer the door / phone under any circumstances

**Police or School Administration Staff will unlock all doors**. Remain in your secure location until this occurs. The following announcement will be made by the Principal or designate Ingeborg Pot or Amanda Anderson or Lana Sillito once lockdown is deactivated, and doors are unlocked by Administration or Police:



# **APPENDIX F: Directions to Medical Facilities**






