COACHES AND CAPTAINS MEETING

As per the ASAA Official Handbook:

"Any team that attends provincials as the zone/regional representatives and fails to attend or send a team representative to the mandatory coaches meeting will be fined a fee of \$250 for failing to send a representative to the coaches meeting. This fee will be collected by the ASAA office and split between the host of the championship and the ASAA; the latter of which will be earmarked for the ASAA subsidy account to help offset costs to ASAA provincial hosts. The executive will have the sole discretion to waive the penalty based on the rationale provided by the school for failure to attend coaches meetings."

MAT TIMES

Teams will have five minutes for photos, five minutes on two strips of mats, five minutes on three strips of mats, and five minutes on a full floor (seven strips of mats). The length that teams will have before they compete will be dependent on the timing of the competition but will be approximately three-five minutes. This will give teams a few mins for water, mental preparation, team rituals etc.

COMPETITION FLOOR

A 42' by 42' (seven mats), non-sprung competition floor will be provided for all teams.

ORDER OF PERFORMANCE

The order of performance for Friday & Saturday will be posted on the ASAA website by April 11th. The order of performance will be reversed for Saturday's competition.

MUSIC

Reminder: New iphones require the headphone to lightning adapter. Coaches are responsible for providing their own adapter.

Competition Floor: An auxiliary cord will be supplied to play all music from personal devices. It is important that the device you are using is in airplane mode and the volume is turned up completely. A designated person must be present to play your music as you see fit. The DJ and MC will not be responsible for playing music.

Warm Up Floor: An auxiliary cord and speakers will be provided on the 7 mat warm up floor.

ATHLETE BAG STORAGE

All teams will have an assigned dressing room to store their belongings. Please do not bring valuables as neither Morinville Community High School, nor The Morinville Leisure Centre, will be responsible for lost, damaged or stolen items. These rooms will not be locked during the competition. We ask that all athletes and coaches respect the dressing rooms. It is expected that the room will be left the way it was found. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

TEAM PHOTOS

Team photos will be taken on Friday and will be included in your mat time. Action shots and awards will also be photographed. Teams will be provided online access to a selection of photos. Additional photos will become available on a website for purchase.

Team photos will be included in this year's program. We will use the photographs submitted with your online registration. Any team that does not submit a suitable photograph by the March 31st registration deadline will not have a team photo in the program.

TEAM HOSTS

Teams will not be assigned a host this year, as the venue is very easy to navigate. However, there will be a number of volunteers stationed around the venue to help with the flow and assist with any questions.

SCORING INFORMATION

SCORE CHECK

A Score Check station will be available in the upper concourse, across from where the judging panel is set up.

DEDUCTION SHEETS

Coaches will review their teams' deduction sheets at the Score Check station only, as deduction sheets must remain at Score Check.

SCORE APPEALS

Coaches may submit an appeal for deductions received through the ACA's Score Check & Appeal Policy. The Score Check Judge will not provide video playback unless an appeal is submitted. Teams can receive additional deductions during the appeal process.

SCORE SHEETS

Score Sheets will be available for coaches to pick up after the end of the awards ceremony from the Score Check station.

RESULTS

Comparative results, by division, will be emailed to coaches by the event host within 48 hours of the event.

RULES & SCORING

All scholastic divisions will follow the Cheer Canada <u>Canadian Scholastic</u> <u>Cheer ICU Rules & Regulations</u>. It is the coaches' responsibility to ensure their routine meets the necessary requirements.

All rule clarifications must be done in advance according to the <u>Scholastic</u> <u>Legality Clarification Guidelines</u> which can be found at: albertacheerleading.ca/bylaws-policies-committees.

Teams will be adjudicated using the Cheer Canada Scholastic Cheer Comparative System and Score Sheets. A copy of the Score Sheets can be found at cheercanada.ca/education/score-sheets.

Information regarding scoring can be found in Scholastic <u>Scoring 101</u> also located on the Cheer Canada website.

All teams must have an ACA-certified coach who is certified to the level they are coaching.

All participants (e.g.: coaches, CIT's, athletes, staff advisors) must be current ACA members in good standing and adhere to Cheer Canada policies and to the ACA policies and procedures, such as those listed below:

- ACA Bylaws
- Code of Conduct
- Social Media Policy
- Score Appeal Policy Samp; Form
- Unsportsmanlike Conduct Policy

APPEAL COMMITTEE

Appeals can be heard on process only. **The decision of the judges is final**. The committee will consist of three members who are not in a conflict of interest position. Appeals must be directed to ASAA Cheer Commissioner, Holly-Ann Elliott.

AWARDS INFORMATION

PROVINCIAL AWARDS

The top three places in each official ASAA category – Intermediate, Advanced All Girl, Advanced All Gender and Game Day will receive medals and a keeper plaque. The first place winner will receive a trophy to keep in their school for one year and will receive a banner and Championship T-shirts from ASAA.

NOVICE AWARD

At the Provincial Competition, a plaque will be given to the best novice team at the competition.

- Must be competing in their first or second provincial cheerleading competition within the last decade.
- Achieves the highest mark out of the eligible teams in any category

SPORTSMANSHIP AWARDS

Sportsmanship is a truly important aspect of the sport of cheerleading and the ASAA championship. It is defined in Merriam-Webster's dictionary as: "fair play, respect for opponents, and polite behaviour by someone who is competing in a sport or other competition; conduct (as fairness, respect for one's opponent, and graciousness in winning and losing) becoming to one participating in a sport"

We respectfully ask that teams do not make, bring or exchange gifts or other items that could be misconstrued as bribery (ie: handing out candy, passing out spirit sticks etc.). This undermines the essence and integrity of sportsmanship, the sportsmanship award and sportsmanship pins.

One sportsmanship banner will be given to one team at the ASAA Provincial Cheerleading Championship. The team receiving this award will represent the true spirit of sportsmanship, integrity, ethics and fair play.

Each team present at Provincials will be asked to select a team that best exemplifies the qualities of sportsmanship throughout the competition. Coaches will be provided with a ballot that they will complete based on their team's decision. The rationale in having the teams select the award winner is that they interact with one another throughout the two day event and will have the best insight into which teams are truly sportsmanlike.

Teams will vote for one team and the ASAA Commissioner will collect teams' votes on Saturday before the end of the competition. The final decision is at the discretion of the ASAA rep, Committee Chair and ASAA Cheerleading Commissioner. Sportsmanship pins will be given to individuals who exhibit outstanding displays of integrity, fair play and good sportsmanship. These pins may be given to players, coaches, parents and spectators. These individuals should be recognized for bringing positive presence to the championship and demonstrating consistent exemplary sportsmanlike behaviour. Recipients of a sportsmanship pin should show exemplary behaviour.

For Individual Sportsmanship pin awards, nominations will be collected through an online form. To nominate an athlete, official, or fan from another school scan the QR code that will be posted around the event as well as on the <u>ASAA Championship Website</u> and fill out an evaluation on how this individual "Sets the Bar" for others including what set them apart. Nominators must be from a different school than the nominee, and must have at least 2 of the criteria indicated in the nomination form to be considered. Recipients should be those who raise the standard and set the car for others to strive for in terms of sportsmanlike and positive sporting behaviour.

FIRST AID

Morinville Fire Department will be on site Friday and Saturday, they will be located in the competition area. The first aid station will not be supplying athletic tape nor will they be taping athletes. Please ensure you are bringing your own supplies. Multiple AEDs and fire extinguishers can be found around the venue.

EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

- Dial 911
- Give address MORINVILLE LEISURE CENTRE, 25126 SH 642, STURGEON COUNTY AB, T8R 2P9
- Explain to dispatch the nature of injury or incident
- Report back to teacher/coach/committee Members
- Meet Ambulance

WHEN AN INJURY OCCURS

- 1. When coming in contact with the injured student/athlete, take control and assess the situation. Exercise universal precautions related to blood and body fluids.
- 2. Do NOT move the injured person
- 3. Send someone to get the onsite First Aid help. They will take charge. In the unlikely event of first aid being unavailable, continue as per 4-10
- 4. Assess the injury-evaluate the severity of the injury and decide if further assistance is required.
- 5. If an ambulance is not needed, decide what action is to be taken to remove the injured party for the playing surface.
- 6. If an ambulance is required-request that another person calls 911. Have them report back to you with an estimated time of arrival and send them to the entrance to wait.
- 7. Observe the injured party carefully for any change in condition.
- 8. When the ambulance arrives, describe the incident and what has been done.
- 9. An adult should be designated to accompany the injured party to the hospital.
- 10. Contact the parent/guardian of the injured athlete/student.

FIRE ALARM & EVACUATION PROCEDURES Morinville Leisure Centre (MLC)

- All fire alarms are to be treated as emergencies. As soon as the fire alarm sounds, a complete evacuation of the building will commence.
- All guests within the MLC will leave in an orderly fashion to the closest emergency exit.
 The Muster point is located outside in the south parking lot. You will be directed by MLC Staff.
- Leave immediately, MLC Staff will enact the Fire ERP and sweep the building.
- When it can be determined that the building is safe to be re-entered, the MLC Staff Warden member will make an announcement to the group.




