

Team Registration

Registration for teams will begin at 4:30 PM in front of the East Gym. Coaches packages will be available and you will be directed to your team room by your team host.

Team Rooms

All teams will have an assigned classroom to store their belongings. Please do not bring valuables as W.P. Wagner is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen items. These rooms will not be locked during the competition.

We ask that all athletes and coaches respect the classrooms and the belongings found in the room.

It is expected that the room will be left the way it was found. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

There will be a lost and found established at the end of the competition. You can contact Amanda Palmer (amanda.palmer@epsb.ca) to inquire about lost items until the end of the day on April 12th. At that time, items will either be disposed of or donated to a local charity.

Team Hosts

Team Leaders will be available to escort you to your designated classroom at check-in and will also escort you to photos and mat times.

Captains Meeting

(a designated athlete who has been selected by their coach to represent their team) There will be a Captains Meeting taking place on Friday, April 5th, 2024 at 4:50 PM in the East Mall.

As per the ASAA Official Handbook:

"Any team that attends provincials as the zone/regional representatives and fails to attend or send a team representative to the mandatory coaches meeting will be fined a fee of \$250 for failing to send a representative to the coaches meeting. This fee will be collected by the ASAA office and split between the host of the championship and the ASAA; the latter of which will be earmarked for the ASAA subsidy account to help offset costs to ASAA provincial hosts. The executive will have the sole discretion to waive the penalty based on the rationale provided by the school for failure to attend coaches meetings."

Order of Performance

The order of performance for Friday & Saturday will be posted on the ASAA website by March 23rd. The order of performance will be reversed for Saturday's Competition. Spectators will not receive individualized orders of performance, however, the order will be posted next to the ticket table. Spectators are welcome to take a picture for their own reference.

Competition Floor

A seven-mat (42' by 42'), non-sprung competition floor will be provided for all teams.

Team Photos

Team photos will be taken on Friday and will be included in your mat time.

Team photos will be included in this year's program. We will use the photographs submitted with your online registration. Any team that does not submit a suitable photograph by the April 1st registration deadline will not have a team photo in the program. Coaches will be required to confirm that their team rosters in the SRS are confirmed and accurate, any changes made on the SRS after April 1st will not be included in the Championship Program.

Mat Times

Teams are guaranteed mats for warm-up, stretch, tumbling, and stunting in the practice gym prior to competing. The length that teams will be on deck is dependent on the timing of the competition.

Technical Requirements for Music

Competition Floor: An auxiliary cord will be supplied for music to be played off of personal devices. D.J. will not have a converter for iPhone 7 and newer. Coaches are responsible for providing their own converter.

It is important that the device you are using is on airplane mode so phone calls or texts do not interrupt the playing of the music.

The volume on the device should be at maximum.

A designated person must be present to play and pause your team's music as you see fit. The DJ will **NOT** do this for you.

Practice Floor: A portable speaker with an auxiliary cord or Bluetooth will be available on the seven mat during warm-up for coaches to use. No converter will be supplied for iPhone 7 and newer.

Scoring Information

Score Check

Score Check Location

A score check station will be available in the mezzanine spectator area next to the judges station.

Deduction Sheets

Coaches will review their team's deduction sheets at the Score Check station. The deduction sheet must remain at Score Check.

Appeals

Coaches may submit a score appeal for any deductions received through the ACA's <u>Score Check & Appeal Policy.</u> The Score Check Judge will not provide video playback unless an appeal is properly submitted. Teams can receive additional deductions during the appeal process.

Score Sheets

Score Sheets will be available for coaches to pick up after the end of the awards ceremony from the Score Check station.

Results

Comparative results, by division, will be emailed to coaches by the event host within 48 hours of the event.

Rules & Judging

All scholastic divisions will follow the Cheer Canada <u>Canadian Scholastic Cheer ICU</u> <u>Rules & Regulations.</u> It is the coach's responsibility to ensure their routine meets the necessary requirements.

All rule clarifications must be done in advance according to the <u>Scholastic Legality Clarification Guidelines</u>, which can be found at: www.albertacheerleading.ca/bylaws-policies-committees

Teams will be adjudicated using the Cheer Canada Scholastic Cheer Comparative System and Score Sheets. A copy of the Score Sheets can be found at: www.cheercanada.ca/education/score-sheets

Information regarding scoring can be found in <u>Scholastic Scoring 101</u>, also located on the Cheer Canada website.

All teams must have an ACA-certified coach who is certified to the level they are coaching.

All participants (e.g. Coaches, CITs, Athletes, Staff Advisors) must be current ACA members in good standing and adhere to ACA policies and procedures, such as those listed below:

- Code of Conduct
- Social Media Policy

- Score Appeal Policy & Direction
- Unsportsmanlike Conduct Policy

Appeal Committee

Appeals can be heard on process only. **The decision of the judges is final.** The committee will consist of three members who are not in a conflict of interest position.

ASAA Code of Ethics & Cheerleading Policy

Please refer to the 2022-2023 ASAA Policy Handbook - Code of Ethics (pages 20-25) all coaches, athletes, officials, volunteers and spectators are expected to abide by these policies. This handbook can be found at: www.asaa.ca

Awards

Teams will be asked to sit around the mats (not on them) during the awards ceremony. The top 3 teams in each category will be awarded. Awards will be handed to the team captains to distribute to their teams. Once the team has received their awards, they will come up for a team photo. After the photo the team will exit the mats.

Provincial Awards

The top three places in each official ASAA category – Intermediate, and Advanced All Girl will receive medals and a keeper plaque. The first place winner will receive a trophy to keep in their school for one year, and a banner plus Championship T-shirts from ASAA.

Sportsmanship Awards

Sportsmanship is a truly important aspect of the sport of cheerleading and the ASAA championship. It is defined in Merriam-Webster's dictionary as: "fair play, respect for opponents, and polite behaviour by someone who is competing in a sport or other competition; conduct (as fairness, respect for one's opponent, and graciousness in winning and losing) becoming to one participating in a sport"

We respectfully ask that teams do not make, bring or exchange gifts or other items that could be misconstrued as bribery (ie: handing out candy, passing out spirit sticks etc.). This undermines the essence and integrity of sportsmanship, the sportsmanship award and sportsmanship pins.

One sportsmanship banner and Perpetual Plaque will be given to one team at the ASAA Provincial Cheerleading Championship. The team receiving this award will represent the true spirit of sportsmanship, integrity, ethics and fair play.

Each team present at Provincials will be asked to select a team that best exemplifies the qualities of sportsmanship throughout the competition. Posters will be displayed around the competition area with a QR code which will lead coaches to an online form. This will provide coaches with the ability to nominate a team based on their team's decision. The rationale in having the teams select the award winner is that they interact with one another throughout the two-day event and will have the best insight into which teams are truly sportsmanlike.

Teams will vote for one team and the Host will tally the votes on Saturday before the end of the competition. The final decision is at the discretion of the ASAA rep and the Committee Chair. Sportsmanship pins will be given to individuals who exhibit outstanding displays of integrity, fair play and good sportsmanship. These pins may be given to players, coaches, parents and spectators. These individuals should be recognized for bringing positive presence to the championship and demonstrating consistent exemplary sportsmanlike behaviour. Recipients of a sportsmanship pin should show exemplary behaviour.

For Individual Sportsmanship pin awards, nominations will be collected through the same online form. To nominate an athlete, official, or fan from another school scan the QR code that will be posted around the event as well as on the ASAA Championship Website and fill out an evaluation on how this individual "Sets the Bar" for others including what sets them apart. Nominators must be from a different school than the nominee, and must have at least 2 of the criteria indicated in the nomination form to be considered. Recipients should be those who raise the standard and set the bar for others to strive for in terms of sportsmanlike and positive sporting behaviour.

General Information

Admission

Spectators are to enter the building through the main entrance only. **If spectators arrive prior to this time, they will not be permitted entry.**

W.P. Wagner will not be responsible for broken, lost or stolen wristbands. These wristbands will not be replaced.

Coaches (maximum of four per team) will receive wristbands. These wristbands will allow coaches to gain entrance to the warm-up area, competition area, and score check. Those without a wristband will not be permitted in these areas. Please contact the event coordinator if you require more passes.

Parking & Drop Off

There will be reserved parking for coaches and judges in the parking lot on the south side of the school. Please look for signage.

Spectators will need to take advantage of the parking found in the following lots or locations:

-Southside parking lot

- -Street parking along Wagner Road
- -The nearby Davies Transit Center is located a 5-minute walk from the school for additional transportation options.

*DO NOT PARK IN THE NEARBY BUSINESS PARKING OR YOU WILL BE TICKETED AND TOWED.

Teams arriving by bus should be dropped off at the school's main entrance on the south side of the building.

Athletes and spectators can enter the building through the shipping receiving doors in the main parking lot. Please see the attached map.

Concession

There will be a concession selling a variety of items. **Cash, Debit and Credit will be accepted.**

Vendors

There will be a variety of vendors selling items. Having cash on hand will be a good idea, although some may accept debit and credit as well.

First Aid

Emergency Protocol

1. Dial 911 and give the address:

- 2. Explain to dispatch the nature of the injury or incident
- 3. Report back to teacher/coach/committee members
- 4. Meet ambulance


When an Injury Occurs

- 1. When coming in contact with the injured student/athlete, take control and assess the situation. Exercise universal precautions related to blood and body fluids.
- 2. Do NOT move the injured person.
- 3. Send someone to get the onsite First Aid help.
- 4. Assess the injury evaluate the severity of the injury and decide if further assistance is required.
- 5. If an ambulance is not needed, decide what action is to be taken to remove the injured party from the playing surface.
- 6. If an ambulance is required request that another person call 911. Have them report back to you with an estimated time of arrival and send them to the entrance to wait.
- 7. Observe the injured party carefully for any change in condition.
- 8. When the ambulance arrives, describe the incident and what has been done.
- 9. An adult should be designated to accompany the injured party to the hospital.
- 10. Contact the parent/guardian of the injured athlete/student.

Fire Alarm and Evacuation Procedures

Fire alarms may be activated as a result of:

- a) a planned evacuation drill.
- b) accidental, mischievous or dangerous actions.
- c) a fire, explosion or chemical spill in the building.

Note: All alarms are to be treated as emergencies. As soon as the alarm sounds, a complete evacuation of the building will commence unless the principal or designate cancels the evacuation using the public address system.

- a) All guests within the school will leave in an orderly fashion. Please move to a location well away from the building, to the main street sidewalk area. It is vitally important to keep clear of the doorways and to leave clear access to the building for firefighters, police or other emergency personnel. In the event that we are dealing with inclement weather and it is necessary to stay out for a long period of time we have the option to request that ETS dispatch buses to provide shelter.
- b) The last person in the room will check to see that everyone has left the room and that the doors have been closed. Do not lock doors and do not switch off the lights.
- c) When it can be determined that the building is safe to be re-entered, an announcement will indicate the "all clear" (1 long bell) for re-entry into the building.

Lock Down Procedures

A lock down may be activated as a result of:

- a) a bomb threat
- b) threatening persons
- c) emergency situations
- a) All guests who may safely leave the school will do so in an orderly fashion.
- b) Persons who are unable to leave the building will attempt to find a safe place (ie: washroom, storage room, classroom) in which they may remain silent and out of sight.
- c) Lights should be turned off in the designated area and blinds should be closed.
- d) Individuals within the school should refrain from using the classroom phone and their personal cell phones.
- e) When it can be determined that the building is safe, an announcement will indicate the "all clear" (said three times by a designated individual).
- f) If the fire alarm is triggered during a lock down, do not leave your safe place.
