



These meetings will be in-person and coaches will meet in the ICSS Staff Room and captains in the Band/Choir room. Please ensure you have a representative at the coaches' meeting as this is where pertinent championship information is provided, and fees are collected. The entry fee must be brought to the coaches' meeting in one cheque.				
TEAM HOSTS:	Throughout the tourney there will be six host students on duty who will be available to you. These people will lead you during the opening ceremonies and will be available to assist you and your team with any questions or needs during the tournament.

RULES/POLICY:	It is incumbent upon all coaches and participants to be aware of ASAA Policy. Specifically for this event, player eligibility, supervision policy and the basketball policy.		
DISCIPLINE AND MISCONDUCT:	Breaches of the ASAA Code of Ethics are treated seriously, and as host, Immanuel Christian Secondary School is required to report any breaches to the ASAA office where action may occur. A portion of the ASAA Code of Ethics states, "Any conduct, including, but not limited to ejections, fighting and drugs and alcohol use, that results in dishonor to the athlete, the team, the school or the ASAA will not be tolerated."		
GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE:	The committee will have the authority to address issues of a serious nature that may occur before, during or after the provincial championships, or to hear appeals of the automatic suspension resulting from an ejection. SPORTSMANSHIP:	Sportsmanship is vitally important and valued by the ASAA. A Sportsmanship plaque and pins will be awarded to the team that displays appropriate conduct & sportsmanship both individually and at a team level throughout the Championship. Pins will be handed out throughout the Championship to individuals & spectators who display sportsmanship in their words & actions. The sportsmanship committee will be deciding who receives these awards. See Appendix B for the criteria and process for awards. SPORTS MEDICINE/ ATHLETIC TRAINER	Teams must bring their own medical supplies and plan to do their own taping. Ice will be provided. A certified athletic trainer will be on site at Immanuel Christian Secondary School for the duration of the tournament to assist with any first aid/sports medicine needs.		

EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN	Our facility has Emergency Exit Signs posted in every room in the unlikely event of a fire or other emergency. Only front entrances will be open for entry into the building. Our gymnasium has emergency exit doors which will be utilized if necessary. Upon exiting the building, all coaches are responsible to ensure their team members are kept in a group and need to report any athletes unaccounted for to a member of the organizing committee. The muster points are north of the school across the street and the east side of the school in the parking lot. Further instructions in emergency situations will be dealt with as instructed by the Lethbridge Emergency Services personnel.

WHEN AN INJURY OCCURS:	 Take control of the situation. Exercise universal precaution related to blood/body fluids. Do not move the athlete if they cannot move themselves. Do not remove uniform unless deemed necessary. Assess and evaluate the severity of the situation and decide if further assistance is required. If an ambulance is required; then determine the action required to remove the athlete from the playing surface. If an ambulance is called: Direct one person to call the ambulance and give the pertinent information to them. Include the location, address, and extent of injury. Ask the person to report back with ETA. Remain with injured athlete and address and concerns they have while awaiting medical attention. Do not give food or drink to injured athlete unless required because of existing medical conditions. Stay calm and reassuring. Once an ambulance arrives, explain the situation and what has been done for the injured athlete. Designate an adult to accompany the injured athlete to the hospital. Parents /guardians of the injured athlete must be contacted as soon as possible following the injury. Complete the incident/accident report form available from the score table and return it to the tournament organizers/administrators.

PROTOCOL IN EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY

- 1. Call Ambulance or Fire Department 9-1-1
- 2. Immanuel Christian Secondary School 802 6th Ave. N, Lethbridge, AB
- 3. Ask them to use main north doors to the school.
- 4. Indicate location and nature of injury.
- 5. Report to organizers / administrators
- 6. Meet ambulance.
