# FROM THE ASAA Executive Director

Well, it has now been three years since an ASAA Basketball championship has been held and it is very exciting for me to be welcoming students and coaches back to school sport on behalf of the ASAA.

I have never taken school athletics for granted – it has been a passion of mine since I was a high school student, then later a high school teacher coach and for many years now, a high school athletics administrator. What I did learn over the past two years since the pandemic started was that the passion students, coaches and parents/ guardians have for school spots is alive and well.

Whilst we lost many school athletic opportunities during the pandemic, the reports I have received through the 2021/22 school year so far point to an increased interest in school athletics from both an athlete and a spectator perspective.

Studies have shown that the levels of anxiety and depression in student athletes increased significantly as a result of losing school sport, and I trust we will see much more positive mental health in our student athletes resulting from a return to school sport. While we must remain vigilant in the ways we reduce the potential for communicable disease spread in school sports, we must be grateful for the opportunities that now present themselves for students to participate in as safe a setting as is possible given the enhanced sanitization and other modifications being applied at this event.

I wish to thank the 2A Girls Basketball Championship host Leigh Bretzlaff, the students and volunteers at Oilfields High School for hosting this event. I also want to thank them for pivoting many times as Government restrictions have changed and impacted their planning. They will do all they can to ensure a safe and enjoyable event for student athletes, coaches and spectators both here and at home via livestreaming. We cannot run our championships without these outstanding volunteers.

#### ASAA Spectator Code of Conduct

Spectators, both student and adult, must demonstrate courtesy and good sportsmanship by positive cheers of encouragement for their team, not against the opposing team. This is evidenced by the absence of booing and vulgarities. Spectators must also show proper acceptance of the officials' judgement.

Artificial noisemakers are not permitted during provincial championship tournaments/events. These noisemakers may include but are not limited to: air horns, cowbells, plastic tube horns, garbage can lids, etc. The provincial championship host shall have the authority to eject from the competition facility individuals who, following a warning, refuse to comply with this requirement.

The executive Committee or its host/designated representative shall have the authority to direct any person to immediately leave any premises or venue hosting any ASAA sanctioned event if that person:

- 1. exhibits rude of abusive behavior to any other person
- 2. uses vulgar, obscene, or abusive language and/or gestures
- 3. fails to promptly follow a reasonable direction given to that person by the designated representative of the ASAA
