WETASKIWIN'S NAME COMES FROM THE CREE WORD WĪTASKIWINIHK, MEANING "THE HILLS WHERE PEACE WAS MADE".

WETASKIWIN WAS Originally called **Siding 16** because it was The 16th stop in the line North of Calgary.

WETASKIWIN IS ONE OF Alberta's oldest cities. Founded in 1892, the Community grew quickly with Wetaskiwin becoming a town In 1902 and a **city in 1906**.

CENTRALLY LOCATED, WETASKIWIN IS 30 MINUTES FROM Edmonton, 30 Minutes from Pigeon Lake, and an hour from Red deer. BUILT IN 1909, WETASKIWIN'S WATER TOWER IS ONE OF THE OLDEST MUNICIPAL WATER TOWERS IN CANADA. THE 42-METRE-HIGH STRUCTURE HAS TOWERED ABOVE WETASKIWIN SINCE 1909 AND HOLDS 454,609 LITRES OF WATER.

CHECK OUT ONE OF MANY LOCALLY OWNED RESTAURANTS OR CHAINS. YOU ARE LIKELY TO FIND ANY TYPE OF FOOD OR BEVERAGE YOU ARE LOOKING FOR HERE!

WETASKIWIN HAS A WEALTH OF TALENTED PEOPLE LIVING HERE. CHECK OUT THE WETASKIWIN AND COUNTY SPORTS HALL OF FAME AT THE **CO-OP TWIN ARENAS** OR PURCHASE A TICKET TO SEE A PERFORMANCE AT THE **MANLUK THEATRE**.

CITY HALL (ACROSS THE STREET FROM WCHS) WAS ORIGINALLY WETASKIWIN'S COURT HOUSE, BUILT IN 1907. IN THE EARLY YEARS, THE BASEMENT OF THE COURTHOUSE CONTAINED THE JAIL CELLS AND THE NORTHWEST MOUNTED POLICE RESIDENCE. THE CELLS ARE IN THEIR ORIGINAL STATE, AND STILL CONTAIN THE ORIGINAL CARVINGS PRISONERS ETCHED INTO THE BRICK WALLS. WETASKIWIN IS ONE OF VERY FEW CITIES IN ALBERTA THAT YOU CAN SHOW UP LATE FOR ANYTHING, AND ARE FORGIVEN WITH ONE WORD... "TRAIN"
