### **COACHES & CAPTAINS MEETING:**

Coaches meeting and a separate team captains meeting will be held on **Wednesday Nov. 22<sup>nd</sup> at 9:00pm.** Both meetings will be held at St. Mary's School. These meetings are mandatory. ### **Game Rules and Information**

<u>OFFICIALS:</u>	There will be carded officials, two score keepers and line judges will be used for all matches.
MINOR OFFICIALS:	Scorekeepers and line judges will be provided for each match. The line judge for your match may be your team host. Please treat them professionally and respectfully.
OFFICIAL GAME BALL:	Tachikara SV5W Gold-SWB
PRACTICE BALLS	Each team must provide their own clearly marked volleyballs to use during warm up and your scheduled practice time

TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE:	As per ASAA rules as laid out in the ASAA Policy Handbook.
<u>AWARDS CEREMONIES:</u>	Medal presentations will be made immediately following each Gold Medal, Bronze Medal and Consolation match. At the completion of the Gold Medal match, the Champions will receive gold medals, keeper plaque, annual plaque, championship t-shirts, and the championship banner. The second and third medalists will receive silver and bronze medals respectively, keeper plaque and annual plaque. Fourth place teams will receive a keeper plaque and annual plaque.
<u>RESULTS:</u>	Results will be available at or at the results centre right outside the Gymnasium.

### **SPORTSMANSHIP:**

**Sportsmanship:** Criteria for team/individual sportsmanship awards will be included in coach's packages as well as given to the committee at the beginning of Provincials. Coaches are asked to fill out nomination papers prior to the end of the Championship. Award will be announced throughout the tournament as well as within one week of event.

**Sportsmanship Pin Award:** Sportsmanship pins may be given to individuals who exhibit outstanding displays of integrity, fair play and good sportsmanship. Sportsmanship pins may be given to players, coaches, parents and spectators.

Recipients of sportsmanship pins should show some or many of the following characteristics:

### Players should:

- ✓ Conduct themselves in a positive nature/manner before, during and after the game
- ✓ Offer positive feedback to opponents during the game
- ✓ Shake hands before and after the game
- ✓ Be courteous, polite and friendly ü Show good sportsmanship during the game
- ✓ Show concern, respect or empathy for an opponent

### Spectators should:

- ✓ Consistently give positive feedback to players and others
- ✓ Welcome opponents
- ✓ Present positive comments before, during and after the game
- ✓ Be helpful to others (i.e. willingly offer information about the game, score, scheduling, venue locations, etc. to onlookers)

### Fair Play and Sportsmanship:

All competitions must be conducted with a high standard of courtesy, fair play and sportsmanship. All those involved share this responsibility.

- A. **Coaches** The coaches must demonstrate qualities of courtesy and good sportsmanship. These are evidenced by proper acceptance of officials' judgment, positive encouragement of player performance and bench behavior.
- B. **Athletes** Athletes must demonstrate qualities of courtesy and good sportsmanship by proper acceptance of officials' judgment and by showing proper respect for opposing athletes as well as for teammates.

- C. **Cheerleaders** Cheerleaders must demonstrate courtesy and good sportsmanship by the appropriateness and timeliness of the cheers they lead, respect for the other cheerleaders and athletes, and their attempts at effective crowd control.
- D. **Spectators** Spectators, both student and adult, must demonstrate courtesy and good sportsmanship by positive cheers of encouragement for their team, not against the opposing team. This is evidenced by the absence of booing and vulgarities. Spectators must also show proper acceptance of officials' judgment. Artificial noisemakers are not permitted during provincial championship tournaments/events. These noisemakers may include but are not limited to: air horns, cowbells, plastic tube horns, garbage can lids, etc. The provincial championship host shall have the authority to eject from the competition facility individuals who, following a warning, refuse to comply with this requirement.
- E. **Administrators** and Teachers Administrators and teachers must demonstrate courtesy and good sportsmanship by their positive examples

### CRITERIA FOR TEAM/INDIVIDUAL SPORTSMANSHIP AWARDS

5	Cheers for good players and good plays, even by opponents Does not display a temper Invites <i>all</i> others to participate Changes players on teams to keep the game fair (coaches/ assistant coaches) Accepts winning and losing with grace Politely questions decisions of officials when unsure
4	Cheers teammates' great plays Maintains self-control Encourages friends on team Works hard for self and team
3	Encourages teammates Takes unfair advantage of other players Plays well when on winning team and while being observed Controls temper Complains about others following the rules
2	Bends the rules to suit own needs Complains about others following the rules Displays frustration and anger; mild temper exhibited
1	Physical and verbal abuse to opposition, teammates, officials and/or fans Nags teammates when they perform poorly Complains (about calls, other players, coach) Concern for self; e.g., ball-hog

### LOCAL RULES:

Coaches are asked to inform their players of the following:

- 1. The schools are not responsible for any lost articles. Please inform your players that in order to safeguard valuables they must be given to the coach or other reliable person or locked in the change room.
- 2. Athletes are to be in designated areas only as regular classes will be ongoing at all schools on Thursday and Friday.

### **CHANGE ROOMS:**

**St. Mary's School**: Teams will be provided meetings rooms before their scheduled matches. Please do NOT leave any valuable in the change rooms after your scheduled match.

**WR Myers High School**: Due to school being in session only common change rooms will be available in the gymnasium. Please do NOT leave any valuable in the change rooms.

Coaches are reminded that they are responsible for their team's behavior on and off the court in the school. **Please, no warming up in hallways and change rooms.** 

### **COACHES' LOUNGE:**

Food and beverages will be available, free of charge, for coaches and officials. The coaches and officials room will be located in the Library. There will only be an officials room located at WR Myers High School.

### **LIVE STREAMING:**

All matches will be streamed live on the Sportscanada.tv website. Please see the 2A Boys Provincial Volleyball website for the direct link to the games being streamed.

### **FIRST AID:**

Certified Athletic Therapist Amanda Bergen Henengouwen will be at St. Mary's School all weekend. She will provide first aid, taping and treatment services to any athlete in need. Please feel free to stop by. She will be located in the Fitness Room in the St. Mary's Gymnasium.

Coaches are responsible for having all pertinent medical information for their own tournament participants. Please remember to bring parental contact information, Alberta Health Care numbers, as well as information and supplies relevant to allergies and injuries (i.e. epi-pens).
