The Cree name for Enoch is maskêkosihk (pronounced mas-kay-k-sahk) and translates as 'people of the land of medicine'. Enoch Cultural Pavilion is a sacred site traditionally used for powwows, round dances, cultural camps, sweat ceremonies,

and traditional medicine picking. Enoch Cree Nation is proud and excited to welcome all participants to this event and looks forward to an incredible and historic day of competition.

4km Races- 3km loop, followed by a 1km loop



<u>Course Description:</u> Located in the heart of Enoch Nation, the land of medicine. The course is of easy to medium level with limited elevation gain. The start line is a wide open area that will funnel down to a more narrow trail about 150m beyond the start line. The 1km course runs along the outside perimeter of the old cultural grounds on a flat, grassy lap. The 3km heads out along stunning Yekau lake. The athletes will cross through treed sections, hard sand and grassy areas. There are 4 small rolling hills on the 3km loop and no hills on the 1km loop. Trails are eight to twelve feet in width providing many areas for passing. Running spikes or racing flats are recommended.

Drummers from Enoch Cree Nation will be playing during the races which will inspire and uplift the participants to special race day experiences.

<u>Parking:</u> Upon entering the old cultural grounds all vehicles and buses will be directed to park in marked areas. There will be attendants and signs directing you. Please park in assigned areas only. There will be a 250 - 350m walk down to the tent set up area, finish and start line.

Pets: Please note no pets are allowed on site.

Facilities: Portable toilets will be onsite, no running water on site so please bring your own. Water will be available for sale at the concession.

<u>Medical Services:</u> First aid will be available and onsite and will be located near the start and finish line as well as on course.

<u>Coaches Meeting:</u> There will be a pre-competition meeting for all ZONE HEAD COACHES (1 PER ZONE) virtually on Thursday, October 13th at 7:00pm. All other coaches please join virtually at 7:30pm.

<u>Food for Athletes and Coaches:</u> Athletes and coaches will receive a bagged lunch, which will include a sandwich, beverage and snack. Tickets will be included in the registration package and need to be redeemed at time of lunch pick up. Lunch will be available for pick up from 11am-3pm at the arbor. The meal sponsor is <u>TeachNutrition.ca</u>.

<u>Concession:</u> A concession, located next to the Old Cultural Pavilion, will be open and available for all participants, coaches, community members and spectators. Snack items, gatorade, veggie cups will be available.

Awards:

Immediately after each race the top three finishers will be presented with ASAA medals and places 4 through 10 will receive a place ribbon. As well, there will be a photo taken of each winner with the championship shirt and a separate picture of the top 10 finishers of each race. This will all take place immediately following each award presentation. Team awards for top 1A, 2A, 3A, and 4A schools will be announced at the end of the championship. Nomination cards for sportsmanship awards can be picked up at registration and presented to either the ASAA Commissioner or an ASAA staff member throughout the day. Sportsmanship pins will be presented as soon as possible after the nomination if it is approved.

Results: Individual race results and school classification (1A, 2A, 3A, 4A) school point totals will be posted online during the day.

Grievance Committee and Appeal Process:

A Grievance Committee will be coordinated by the ASAA XC Commissioner and Executive Director. Three zone coaches will be asked to volunteer for this committee, with alternates chosen in the event of a conflict of interest. It is rare that grievances are lodged at Cross Country Provincials, and typically they surround athlete disqualifications, or athletes taking the incorrect path. If an athlete fails to show up on time for their event they will not be permitted to compete in a different age category.

Registration Information:

- 1. Entry and Eligibility Forms: All athlete registrations will be submitted by the zone secretary via the google sheet provided to them by the ASAA. Zone secretaries will be contacted in regards to the registration procedures. Each zone is allowed to send 18 runners and all entries must be submitted by Wednesday, Oct. 12th at 4:00pm. All registrations must use the specific google sheet provided. (NOTE: Schools DO NOT submit their own athletes to the host). Para Athletes: Once the zone has registered the athlete via the google sheets please submit the Classification Registration Form to emily@asaa.ca
- 2. <u>Accuracy of Registration</u>: It is each zone/school responsibility to ensure their athletes are properly registered on ExNet. Zone coaches are urged to double check their registration sheets for the six race categories to ensure the athletes information is accurate (spelling of the name, race category, and school classification: 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A.
- 3. <u>Add/Scratch</u>: There will be no changes to the zone registrations after Wednesday, Oct. 12th at 4:00pm. Any athlete that scratches after Wednesday, Oct. 12 will not be replaced and the athlete/school/zone is still responsible for the entry fee of the scratched athlete.
- 4. <u>Fees Zones</u>: Zones will be required to enter the number of athletes going on the team order form online. The entry fee is \$21.00 per athlete
- (this will include the ASAA Loonie Fee). Fees are to be paid at the race site registration table PLEASE MAKE CHEQUES PAYABLE TO: "Ever Active Schools"
- 5. Athlete/School Bib pick up: Coaches can pick up their school packages on Friday/Saturday at the race course. School packages will be by zones.
- 5: <u>No show fee</u>: For any athlete who is registered to compete, and for whom the ASAA does not receive a formal scratch from the zone for the athlete by Friday noon, their zone will still be responsible for the entry fee, and the athlete's school will be charged a \$50 no-show fee.
