When we all take responsibility for our role in sportsmanship we can create a positive sporting environment for all.










Sportsmanship is a truly important aspect of the sport of cheerleading and the ASAA championship. It is defined in Merriam-Webster's dictionary as: "fair play, respect for opponents, and polite behavior by someone who is competing in a sport or other competition; conduct (as fairness, respect for one's opponent, and graciousness in winning and losing) becoming to one participating in a sport".

One sportsmanship banner will be given to one team at the ASAA Provincial Championship. The team receiving this award will represent the true spirit of sportsmanship, integrity, ethics and fair play. This award will be granted after the Championship is over, and delivered by the ASAA.

Each team present at Provincials will be asked to select a team that best exemplifies the qualities of sportsmanship throughout the competition. Coaches will be provided with a ballot that they will complete based on their team's

decision. The rationale in having the teams select the award winner is that they interact with one another throughout the two day event and will have the best insight into which teams are truly sportsmanlike.

#### **Individual Sportsmanship Key Chain Award:**

Sportsmanship pins will be given to individuals who exhibit outstanding displays of integrity, fair play and good sportsmanship. These pins may be given to players, coaches, parents and spectators. These individuals should be recognized for bringing positive presence to the championship and demonstrating consistent exemplary sportsmanlike behavior. Recipients of a sportsmanship pin should show exemplary behavior.

For Individual Sportsmanship pin awards, nominations will be collected through an online form. To nominate an athlete, official, or fan from another school scan the QR code that will be posted around the event as well as on the ASAA Championship Website\_and fill out an evaluation on how this individual "Sets the Bar" for others including what set them apart. Nominators must be from a different school than the nominee, and must have at least 2 of the criteria indicated in the nomination form to be considered. Recipients should be those who raise the standard and set the bar for others to strive for in terms of sportsmanlike and positive sporting behavior.

#### PLAYERS/COACH CODE OF CONDUCT

- Conduct themselves in a positive nature/manner during, before and after the game
  - Offer positive feedback to opponents during the game
    - Shake hands before and after the game
    - Be courteous, polite and friendly at all times
    - Show good sportsmanship during the game
- Show concern, respect or empathy for an opponent-display an outstanding act of sportsmanship, ethics or integrity

#### SPECTATORS/ PARENTS CODE OF CONDUCT

- Consistently give positive feedback to players and others
- Welcome opponents
   Present positive comments before, during and after the game
- Be helpful to others (ie. willingly offer information about the game, score, scheduling, venue locations, etc. to onlookers)
  - Spectators must also show proper acceptance of the official's judgment

#### **NOISEMAKERS**

Noisemakers are NOT permitted during provincial tournament events. These may include but are not limited to: cowbells, air horns, plastic tube horns, garbage cans, clappers, etc. The host committee will give a warning, but has the authority to remove anyone from the facility who chooses not to comply with this requirement.

#### **ASAA CODE OF ETHICS**

Alberta School Athletic Association Code of Ethics: All competitions must be conducted with a high standard of courtesy, fair play and sportsmanship. All those involved share this responsibility.

- A. Coaches The coaches must demonstrate qualities of courtesy and good sportsmanship. These are evidenced by proper acceptance of officials' judgment, positive encouragement of player performance and bench behavior.
- B. Athletes Athletes must demonstrate qualities of courtesy and good sportsmanship by proper acceptance of officials' judgment and by showing proper respect for opposing athletes as well as for teammates.
- C. Cheerleaders Cheerleaders must demonstrate courtesy and good sportsmanship by the appropriateness and timeliness of the cheers they lead, respect for the other cheerleaders and athletes, and their attempts at effective crowd control.
- D. Spectators Spectators, both student and adult, must demonstrate courtesy and good sportsmanship by positive cheers of encouragement for their team, not against the opposing team. This is evidenced by the absence of booing and vulgarities. Spectators must also show proper acceptance of officials' judgment. Artificial noisemakers are not permitted during provincial championship tournaments/events. These noisemakers may include but are not limited to: air horns, cowbells, plastic tube horns, garbage can lids, etc. The provincial championship host shall have the authority to eject from the competition facility individuals who, following a warning, refuse to comply with this requirement.
- E. Administrators and teachers must demonstrate courtesy and good sportsmanship by their positive examples.
- F. Discipline and Misconduct: The following is the ASAA statement on discipline:
  - 1) The head coach, as a representative of the school, is responsible for the conduct of all persons comprising the school's team including assistant coaches, players and bench personnel.
  - 2) For a coach to address, or permit anyone on his/her bench to address uncomplimentary remarks to any official during the progress of a provincial championship, or to indulge in conduct that might incite players or spectators against the officials, is a violation of the rules of the game and must likewise be considered conduct unworthy of a coach.
  - 3) Behavior by any member of a team, including all bench personnel, deemed objectionable conduct as defined in the rulebook shall be immediately subject to the penalty prescribed in the rulebook for such an offense.




# APPENDIX C TOWN OF WHITECOURT MAP

#### **EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN**

## In Case of Emergency: Call 9-1-1

École St. Joseph School – 5575 McIlwaine Drive, Whitecourt, AB École St. Anne School – 3804 47<sup>th</sup> Street, Whitecourt, AB

#### Medical

- A First Aider will be available on site at all times.
- An EMT is available during the event. Call Jessica Brown if one is needed.
  - AED is located outside the main gym doors at St. Joseph and St. Anne.
    - First aid kit and ice available in the designated medical room.
- Designated medical room is the Athletic Director's office in the gymnasium (St. Joseph) and the equipment room in the gymnasium (St. Anne). Ice will be available in these locations when required.
  - For an ambulance call 9-1-1, for the Whitecourt Hospital call 780-778-2285.
  - Use the main entrances at both locations for access in case of an emergency.

#### When an injury occurs:

- 1. Remain calm, take control of the situation and ensure the scene is safe.
- 2. Exercise universal precautions related to blood/bodily fluids, always use PPE.
- 3. Assess the severity of the situation and decide if further assistance is needed.
- 4. If an ambulance is required, direct someone to call 9-1-1 and provide the pertinent info (location/address of event, type of injury, age and gender of patient, if they are conscious and breathing).
  - 5. Consider removing the patient from the court, ONLY IF 100% SAFE TO DO SO.
    - 6. Stay with the patient until help arrives, do not let them eat or drink anything.
    - 7. Ensure there is a designated adult to accompany the patient to the hospital.
  - 8. Ensure the school representative contacts the patient's parents/quardians ASAP.
- 9. Once the patient has been taken by EMS or cleared to stay on site, complete an incident report (provided in this booklet) and provide it to the event organizer.

#### **Evacuation**

- In case of an evacuation, remain calm.
- Find the nearest emergency exit and proceed to it in a calm manner. No running.
  - Move 150 feet away from the building and find the nearest muster point.

#### Lockdown

- In the case of a lockdown, remain calm and guiet.
- Stay where you are and follow instructions from event organizers and school staff.

#### Fire

- In the event of a fire, call 9-1-1 and find the nearest exit.
- Fire extinguishers are located inside the gym at both venues.


