The ASAA is pleased to announce that Brad Van Raalte will be joining the staff of the ASAA at the end of the current school year as its new Assistant **Executive Director.** 

Brad was born and raised in the Edmonton area. He has always loved playing sports and appreciated the opportunity that school sport provided him at Parkland Immanuel Christian School (PICS) which he attended as a student. At PICS, Brad played high school basketball, volleyball and was the first to represent his school in pole vault.

While studying at the University of Alberta for an Education degree, Brad also coached senior boys basketball at PICS. Following University, Brad moved to Perth, Australia for his first teaching position where he spent three years before coming back to Alberta in 2011.
