The ASAA is pleased to be able to send up to four student athletes and two teachers to the 2008 NFHS Student Leadership Conference in Indianapolis, Indiana on July 16-19, 2009.

An outstanding leadership opportunity, the NFHS National Student Leadership Conference is a four-day leadership conference for 300 student and adult leaders who participate in interscholastic athletics and fine arts activity programs through their state high school athletic/activities associations. Starting in 2007, the NFHS set aside a number of subsidized delegate positions for Canadian student and adult participants.

The National Student Leadership Conference provides a forum for student and adult leaders to discuss contemporary issues facing education-based athletics and activities. Through interactive large- and small-group discussions, these leaders will learn to promote respect, positive values, sportsmanship, teamwork, healthy lifestyles, community service and perspective.

College facilitators will deliver the curriculum and lead the delegates in their breakout group discussions. In addition, all delegates will participate in a citywide community service project that will benefit the Indianapolis metropolitan community.
