Athletic Director Forum and Delivery of First Leadership Training Courses

The Athletic Director and Coach Forum at the HPEC/PHE Canada Conference in Banff was a great success. With approximately 120 registrants, the Forum was opened with an inspiring and thought provoking presentation from renowned speaker Bruce Brown; some valuable round table discussions followed. On the afternoon of Thursday April 30, the Alberta Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (AIAAA) delivered the first leadership training course to over 100 athletic directors: 502C Principles, Strategies and Methods. Feedback on 502C so positive that we had about 10 walk-ups to the second course, 501C Philosophy, Organizational Structure and Professional Development, on Friday May 1 where we delivered to over 80 participants. The athletic stream of sessions which we oversaw at the conference was well attended and well received.

AIAAA Initiatives



The ASAA Executive search committee has hired a replacement for Jordan Abney. Jordan's replacement will be announced shortly. The absence of a person in this position has put administration of the education and certification program on hold for about a month, so we ask for your understanding during the transition.

Important Policy Changes for 2009/10

- Appeals to the Executive Appeal Committee will be accompanied by a \$200 appeal fee, of which \$50 will be non-refundable and \$150 will be refunded if the appeal is upheld
- Distributed learning schools may participate in individual sports in a different zone than the distributed learning school belongs if specific criteria is met.

Alberta Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (AIAAA): The ASAA Board passed a new fee of \$50 per member school to assist the administration of the AIAAA. This fee will be added to all school registration fees for 2009/10.

- Badminton has been put on a host rotation, starting 2009/10 with the Edmonton Zone.
- Cross-country: number of athletes/age category/zone was increased from 15 to 18, and alternates were eliminated. Only athletes registered by the deadline will be eligible to run and no athletes can be added after 4 pm Wednesday on the week of the provincial championships.
- Sport Specific School Programs/Courses/Academies:
 The wording of the sport specific school policies was modified to include "courses/academies". The intent of the policy change is that courses/programs that occur during the school day should not be primarily focused on one specific sport. If you have a program that you feel might fall into this category and would like clarification from the ASAA office on that program's eligibility, please send complete program/course/academy details and class schedule to the ASAA office for review john@asaa.ca A response will be provided to you once the ASAA Executive has reviewed the information you send us.
