Welcome Message from John Paton, Executive Director



Another year, another round of opportunities to make a difference in the lives of Alberta's youth through school sport. What are you going to do to make a difference this year? Here is what I am planning.

I plan to continue making every effort to inform administrators, coaches and others about the educational opportunities that are available through ASAA to enhance the lives of high school students through school sport. I will also ensure that our office staff will do the best they can do to serve our member schools, the school administrators, athletic directors and coaches. I want our championship events to continue to be highlights in the lives of students - allowing them to experience the exhilaration of competing against their peers, seeking personal goals and learning about themselves every step of the way. I plan to continue educating myself and to represent you, our member schools, to the best of my ability on a local, provincial and national level - certainly to ensure that the voice of school sport is heard and valued. The tools I have at my disposal are many; here are just a few.

Firstly, the ASAA's recent decision to require schools to have at least one teacher on staff who has taken the *Fundamentals of Coaching* course available online at www.asaawecoach.ca, and to subsidize the cost of that one course from \$85 down to \$50 represents an investment of over \$18,000 by the ASAA into enhancing coach education opportunities in Alberta schools. I thank Rural Alberta Development Fund and Cenovus Energy for making these rebates possible. Some schools have decided that they will require all school coaches to take this course - this shows great leadership, and I strongly recommend others to follow their lead.

Secondly, leading our coaches in schools are the Athletic Directors. If you are an AD and have not yet taken the opportunity, through the Alberta Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (AIAAA) to avail yourself of the professional development courses offered by this association, now is the time to consider it. With the ASAA very close to announcing TQS opportunities tied to the AIAAA curriculum, it is a great time for you to get involved. Not only will you enhance your own professional development, but you will also be doing your coaches and student athletes a favour by improving the way you coordinate your school athletic program. If you feel that you cannot benefit from such courses, I will be bold and suggest that it may be time you handed the role of AD over to someone else. As a life long learner myself, I think the day you think you know it all, or do not need to learn more, is the day you cease doing what you can to optimize the learning opportunities for students in your school; let someone else lead.

The final point I want to make is that you, the reader, are one of our most valuable resources. We have many outstanding young teachers coming into the profession and many of them will coach. I have heard that the young teachers today are not prepared to do what the more experienced amongst us were prepared to do as we began our careers; that is, volunteering to coach many teams and volunteering in other ways. In some cases, I am sure this lack of commitment to extra-curricular activities by beginning teachers exists. However, I like to think the better of people, and instead of writing them off before giving them a chance, I encourage you to embrace the youth, energy and enthusiasm that comes with being a new teacher; harness this outstanding resource and mentor them into being a coach. Not only will you be doing yourself a favour in easing your own workload, but you will be building capacity for the future, and ensuring that school sport stays on as a viable, integral and important component of school life. I wish you the best of success in this challenge and hope you have a great 2012/13 school year.

New ASAA Transfer Form and Appeal Process

ASAA is currently in the process of creating a site that will be found on the ASAA website and will require all transfer forms and appeals to be submitted online. way to submit forms to the office, which will hopefully see a quicker turn around on transfers and will also ensure that all documentation that is required is received in a timely manner.

ASAA On-line Coach Education

The 2011-12 year was an exciting one for the ASAA. In September, the association launched its web portal for online coach educational courses at www.ASAWeCoach.ca. As of right now there are 6 courses available with another 5 in the works.
