

Appeal procedures have been modified.


Transfer procedures reasonings have been clarified and defined.



RE: Changes in Membership Fees

To: All ASAA Member Schools

Dear Administrators of ASAA Member Schools:

At the 2019 Annual General Meeting of the ASAA, there were some adjustments voted into policy by the Board of Governors regarding ASAA membership fees. These changes include:

- An increase from \$30 to \$40 for the Compliance Officer Fee (reflected in the ASAA Fee)
- Addition of a Legal Expense fee
- Addition of a one-time Legal Contingency Fund fee (applicable only for 2019/20)

For your budgeting purposes, we have consolidated the changes into a quick reference guide until the new ASAA Policy Handbook for 2019/20 is available for you.










